What to do in the kitchen

1



Separate your food waste

Food waste is everything left over from cooking and eating that cannot be saved. It includes left-over (both raw and cooked):

- Meat, cheese
- Pasta, rice
- Vegetables
- Root vegetables
- Fruit
- Bread, cake
- Fish and shellfish
- Eggshells
- Tea (including bags)
- Coffee (including filter paper)
- Paper towels and napkins (small amounts)

Put your food waste in paper bags

Always put food waste in VA SYD's paper bags and keep them in a holder to ensure good ventilation. Bags get wet and break if placed in a bucket or on the floor.

Drain off the liquid from sauces, soups and stews run off before putting the waste in the bag.

Put the paper bags in the brown bin

Put food waste bags in the brown bin.

Food waste bins are usually emptied at the same time as non-food waste bins and are collected by trucks fitted with separate compartments. We never mix different types of waste.

Good to know

No plastic!

Never put plastic in the food waste bin, not even so-called biodegradable plastic bags.

Don't put food waste in plastic bags or sacks because plastic makes recycling difficult.



No thanks!

Plastic, blowers, soil, ash, candle wax, cigarettes, tobacco products and chewing gum are not food waste.

Make it even easier

Using a trolley that can hold a 45-litre bag and a waste chute makes it even easier. The trolley is easy to clean, can be rolled on wheels and is easily stored under the sink or in a suitable space.

Collection and maintenance

The brown food waste bin holds 140 litres of waste and collection frequency is up to you. All you need to do is put out the bin with its wheels facing the street on collection day. The driver always checks the contents on collection. Don't forget to clean the bin regularly.

Lots of food waste?

If you have large amounts of food waste we have 140-litre sacks specially designed for our waste bins. You collect your food waste in buckets and empty them into a bag placed in the bin.

More than half of Swedish municipalities collect food waste. Consumers in Burlöv and Malmö are required to sort their food waste and the local municipalities aim to collect 40 percent of it.

More than 34,000 tonnes of food waste is thrown away in these two districts every year. Do you want to help reduce the food waste mountain? Try asking guests if they want a doggy bag to take uneaten food home with them.
